Domestic violence is the use of power and control within an intimate relationship that threatens a person's well-being.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CAN BE

EMOTIONAL: An abuser may...

- continually criticize
- monitor daily travel, phone calls and with whom time is spent
- try to isolate a partner from family or friends
- accuse a partner of cheating

SEXUAL: An abuser may...

- insult in sexual ways or call a partner sexual names
- restrict access to birth control and/or medical care
- not ask for consent or force unwanted sexual activity

FINANCIAL: An abuser may...

- control how money is spent
- deny access to bank accounts
- run up large amounts of debt on joint accounts

PHYSICAL: An abuser may...

- damage property when angry
- push, slap, bite, kick, or choke
- trap a partner at home or keep them from leaving
- hurt children and/or pets
