Addiction Recovery Program

- Hired a Director of Clinical & Recovery Services, a Certified Recovery Specialist, and a Family Case Manager
- 33 women successfully completed our Addiction Recovery Program
- 17 women participated in the graduation in August
- Completed CARF Survey & DMHA Audit



Therapy Services

- Hired a Clinical Supervisor and Music Therapist
- Added a grief group for clients
- 91 individuals have participated in the program
- In addition to individual therapy, we are currently offering 18 therapy groups



Domestic Violence Services

- Virtual Support Group
- Participation in a variety of community-wide awareness initiatives and conferences around domestic violence awareness
- Have served 649 adult survivors as of November 11th
- Saw increased amounts of violence for survivors and DV deaths go up in the community
- Assisted survivors with emergency financial needs
 - Ring Doorbells
 - Cell Phone
 - Legal Fees
 - Moving Costs
 - Transportation Assistance



Residential Services

- Our Assistant Director of Residential Services transitioned to Director of Residential Services.
- Nutritional Coordinator hosts an annual HEAL cooking class and started a new weekly Cooking and Budgeting group for clients to continue to learn those skills.
- Housing Support Group provides assistance navigating housing resources for individuals and families. Participants are taught strategies for affordable housing plans, maintaining a positive rental history, navigating contracts and strengthening overall housing self-sufficiency.
- Empowerment Boutique is more active than ever and is staffed by volunteers, equipped with Amazon donations and uses a points system to incentive client engagement.
- In just the first six months we provided 9,262 bednights.



Housing Services

- Several transitions in program leadership and structure throughout year
- Operated several housing programs for survivors of DV and SV
 - ESG Homeless Prevention
 - TANF Homeless Prevention
 - CoC Rapid Rehousing
 - ESG Rapid Rehousing
- Assisted many survivors with barriers of rent, utility, and deposits to get housed
- So far this year, we have served 30 families



Children's Services

- Daily Summer Outings - Zoo Trip, Botanical Conservatory, Kreager Park, and Splash Pad
- Our Music Therapist held the first music camp this summer culminating with each child making their own ukulele.
- Several special events like a drive-in movie night where children made their own cars out of boxes, a Chalk It Up event for DV Awareness Month, Mother's Day craft project, a Halloween Party, and many more.
- Fort Wayne Public Schools arranged for a back to school event complete with haircuts, school supplies, and new clothes.



Education Services

- Started tracking feedback from teachers following sessions
- Hired a Community Educator
- Restructured the department to become a part of the Advancement Team
- Partnered with Whitley County Domestic Violence Task Force to facilitate a “Safe Bodies, Safe Communities” presentation
- Expanded CyberSense program now offering two programs
- To-date we have presented educational sessions to 3,392 adults and children



Sexual Violence Services

- Adult Support Group - offered virtually and in person
- Adolescent Support Group (13-18) - challenges in attendance looking for new structure in 2026
- Have served 118 survivors as of November 11th
- Increase in human trafficking cases throughout the year
- Stronger referral partnership with Fort Wayne Sexual Assault Treatment Center



Goldstein Family Scholarship Program

- 5 currently participating in the scholarship program
- Earlier this year a past client who graduated from the program reached out and shared:

“I just wanted to reach out and thank you for all of your help and support! I’m working as an ELL elementary teacher now, and I couldn’t have done it without you and YWCA. You’ve really inspired me to empower those students the same way you empowered me. I’m also proud to say that this year my daughter will be graduating from high school with honors! We’ve applied to some colleges, and she’s been accepted!”
